April 25, 2012

A scheduled Regular Meeting of the Borough Council of the Borough of Medford Lakes, New Jersey, was held on the above date in Oaks Hall at Municipal Cabin, 1 Cabin Circle, Medford Lakes, NJ 08055 beginning at 7:00pm. Following the pledge of allegiance and a moment of silence (Council and the public observed a moment of silence to honor service men and women defending our country). Clerk Mark McIntosh read the Open Public Meetings Act: pursuant to the requirements of the Open Public Meetings Act, adequate notice of this scheduled meeting had been provided to the Central Record, Burlington County Times, Courier Post, posted on the official website and official bulletin board of the Borough of Medford Lakes. Those wishing to be notified for changes to scheduled meetings were notified via email or regular mail.

Clerk Mark McIntosh called roll. Mayor Gregory C. Lackey, Deputy Mayor Thomas J. Cranston, Councilman Gary A. Miller, Councilman Jeffrey Fitzpatrick and Councilman Robert D. Hanold, Sr. answered in attendance. Also present were Manager Julie Horner – Keizer, Clerk Mark J. McIntosh and Solicitor Peter C. Lange, Jr.

EXECUTIVE SESSION

Mayor Lackey motioned to close the Regular Meeting and enter a Closed/Executive Session, seconded by Councilman Miller.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 70-12

A RESOLUTION EXCLUDING THE PUBLIC FROM A PUBLIC MEETING

WHEREAS, Section 7.a of Chapter 231, Public Law 1975, otherwise known as the "Open Public Meetings Act" states that except as provided by Section 7.a, all meetings of a public body, such as the Borough Council, shall be open to the public at all times: and,

WHEREAS, Section 7.b provides that the Borough Council may exclude the public only from the portion of a meeting at which Borough Council discusses certain subjects which are listed in the aforementioned Section; and,

WHEREAS, the Borough Council desires to discuss certain subject(s) which are listed in the aforementioned section and desires to exclude the public from the portion of the meeting at which the Borough Council will discuss said subject(s); and,

WHEREAS, Section 8 of Chapter 231, Public Law 1975 states that no public body shall exclude the public from any meeting to discuss any matter described in Section 7.b until the public body shall, at a meeting to which the public shall be admitted, first adopt a resolution making certain statements with respect to the subject(s) to be discussed;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Medford Lakes, in the County of Burlington, State of New Jersey, as follows:

3. That the Borough Council for the aforementioned reasons hereby declares that the public is excluded from the portion of the meeting during which the above discussion shall take place and hereby directs the Borough Clerk to take the appropriate action to effectuate the terms of this resolution.

PUBLIC COMMENT #1

Mayor Lackey opened the meeting to public comment.

Doug Heinold, Esq. on behalf of Carol Latti of Stokes Road – formally explained Ms. Latti’s written request for access to Aetna Way by her contractors.

Mayor Lackey stated that approval would be based upon Police Acceptance of the dates & times.

Councilman Miller motioned for introduction of Resolution Number 77-12, seconded by Deputy Mayor Cranston.

RESOLUTION NUMBER 77-12

A RESOLUTION OF THE MEDFORD LAKES BOROUGH COUNCIL SUSPENDING TRAFFIC RESTRICTIONS ON AETNA WAY

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti owns property adjacent to Aetna Way in the Borough of Medford Lakes and identified as 113 Stokes Road and also known on the Medford Lakes tax map as Block 10034, Lots 5,6,6.01,7 and 8; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti has requested permission from Borough Council to access her property by utilizing the public right of way known as Aetna Way and the walkway adjacent to Aetna Way in order to perform certain landscaping work upon her property; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti has elected to perform the landscaping work subject to the provisions below; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti agrees to have all contractors utilizing Aetna Way issue the Borough a Certificate of Liability Insurance naming the Borough as Additional Insured and sign a hold harmless agreement for the granted access in favor of the Borough and in a form and content acceptable to and approved by the Borough Solicitor; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti agrees to have all contractors provide the Borough with the Gross Vehicle Weight Rating (GVWR) of any vehicles utilizing Aetna Way prior to use of the roadway; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Carol Latti agrees that access to Aetna Way is only granted for ingress and egress and that no work will be performed from Aetna Way nor will any materials or vehicles be stored on Aetna Way during the allowable access time period; and

WHEREAS, the passage of this Resolution shall not be construed in any way as an admission of liability by Medford Lakes Borough related to any damages and/or other claims which may or may not be presented to the Borough by Ms. Carol Latti.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Medford Lakes Borough Council that the use restrictions currently in place restricting the use and passage on Aetna Way and the adjacent pedestrian walkway shall hereby be temporarily suspended between the hours of 9:00am to 2:00pm upon prior notification and approval of the Medford Lakes Police Department in favor of Ms. Carol Latti and her contractors for the sole purpose of accessing the property owned by Ms. Carol Latti between the dates of May 1, 2012 and May 31, 2012.

Shivaun Doyle – Bell of JR’s Corner Store handed Council a letter requesting reconsideration to close Trading Post Way from 5:05pm to 9:00pm for the Farmer’s Market to operate.

NOTE – Deputy Mayor Cranston exited the dais and recused himself from discussion as he is conflicted by being a business owner on Trading Post Way.

Mayor Lackey asked what changes were made other than the start time.

Ms. Doyle – Bell stated along with the time change they were adjusting the market hours and addressing parking issues. She also provided Council with letters of support from; Protestant Community Church, Uni Shippers, Paolini & Scout, Medford Lakes Laundromat, Ivy Green Consignment Boutique, JR’s Corner Store, the Art Studio, Medford Lakes Colony and Boy Scout Troop #48.

Mayor Lackey reiterated that it was still a Friday night request. He stated that many hours have been spent trying to compromise without success.

Councilman Miller stated that it appears that the Friday night closure concerns had been met.

Councilman Miller motioned to approve the request to close Trading Post Way for the times requested to hold the Farm Market, seconded by Councilman Fitzpatrick.

Councilman Hanold stated that he’s sees only a minor change in hours and expressed concern with business owners in support was being pitted against business owners with concerns.

Ms. Doyle – Bell stated that the Market is an important community event and she has personally tried to accommodate all parties.

Councilman Fitzpatrick stated it might be more palatable if the request was for just one Friday night per month. He also expressed support for the Market being located only on Aetna Way and on Saturday mornings.

Councilman Miller stated that he appreciates Ms. Doyle – Bells’ persistence to find compromise and that he supports the request.

Ms. Doyle – Bell stated that she is excited to be at her location and that most of the business owners support the Market and many of them would be willing to help run the market.

Joe Aromando of Shingowack Trail expressed concern with one person attempting to speak for many. It is all hearsay in his mind. He also asked that Council develop a plan for use of streets and employ the Borough’s Planner to assist.

Bob McGowan of Cochise Circle asked that Council not spend any more time on this subject and instead concentrate on monitoring the expenditure of tax dollars.

Jim Riddle of Medford School of Music expressed support of all the businesses on Trading Post Way and described how busy the street is on Friday nights. He stated that either way he would support Councils decision.

Councilman Fitzpatrick asked Mr. Riddle how difficult setup would be if the request was granted on nights that he has the road closed for his outdoor concerts.

Mr. Riddle stated that it would be difficult but reiterated that he will work with whatever Council decides.

Mayor Lackey requested a roll call vote.

BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Borough of Medford Lakes, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, as follows:

WHEREAS, the Borough Council is in receipt of an agreement with the County of Burlington which will provide for participation in the financed solid waste management system for the disposal or recycling of solid waste pursuant to the Burlington County District Solid Waste Management Plan; and

WHEREAS, the Borough Solicitor has found the agreement to be proper and in order; and

WHEREAS, the Borough of Medford Lakes wishes to participate in this program; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Borough Council of the Borough of Medford Lakes that the Mayor and Borough Clerk are hereby authorized to execute said agreement in order to participate in the Solid Waste Management Program of Burlington County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT, certified copies of said Resolution be forwarded to the County of Burlington and the Medford Lakes Public Works Superintendent.

Council expressed concern over the contract being for five-years.

Solicitor Lange recommended tabling the motion until Council's concerns over the contract term could be addressed. He noted that similar concerns were being voiced by other municipalities.

Mayor Lackey turned the meeting over to Manager Horner – Keizer who put on view a powerpoint presentation of the 2012 Municipal Budget. Following the presentation she stated that although a public hearing on the budget would occur this night the actual budget adoption would not take place until the first meeting in May while the Borough awaits NJ State approval.

Mayor Lackey opened the Public Hearing on the 2012 Municipal Budget.

Bob McGowan of Cochise Circle thanked the Manager for a very thorough presentation and thanked Council for their fiscal guidance in creation of the budget. He asked how the Borough stood with grants and what the current surplus figure is. He further asked for the status on delinquent taxes.

Manager Horner – Keizer stated that the Borough has been very successful in receiving grants although at times the Borough is disqualified due to a high percapita income. She also stated that the current surplus is \$892,415 and the Tax Collector provides monthly information on the status of collection.

Joe Aromando of Shingowack Trail expressed his appreciation for the Manager’s presentation and stated that he had recommended similar fiscal responsibility many years ago when he served on Council. He also commented on Capital expenditures and asked if the Auditor would be available for comment on the budget prior to adoption.

Council discussed the anticipated FEMA reimbursement from Hurricane Irene.

Mayor Lackey closed the Public Hearing on the 2012 Municipal Budget.

PUBLIC COMMENT #2

Mayor Lackey opened the meeting for public comment.

Rudy Levak of Onondago Trail asked for an update on the letter sent to Burlington County regarding flat tires on Public Works trucks after going to the County dump.

Councilman Hanold stated that after further review the tire purchase included spares and wasn’t directly attributed to conditions at the dump.

Bob McGowan of Cochise Circle expressed support for the decision to relocate voting District #4’s polling location from the fire house to Neeta School. He commented on prior housekeeping conditions within the firehouse.
